JOINT RESOLUTIONS LOOKING TO THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A NATIONAL ORGANIZATION OF ROTARY CLUBS.

Whereas, on February 25, 1904, there was founded Rotary Club of Chicago, an association of business men who were desirous of premoting the business interests of each other, of advancing civic affairs, of enjoying good fellowship; and

Whereas, Rotary Club of Chicago has succeeded in its objects, has prospered and grown to a membership in the hundreds; and

"We [veteran Rotarians], of course, all know that nobody knows the exact date of that

talkfest...



...We decided that Rotary should have a birthday, and guessed at the date, Feb. 23, 1905, and adopted it for future use"




